BE LAKE SMART and don't feed the algae.

Phosphorous and nitrogen help algae grow. High levels of both lead to excessive blue-green algae growth which produces harmful toxins, foul odors, and unappealing water.

This becomes a Harmful Algae Bloom that affects human and animal health, and water recreation. Below are ways to reduce algae growth .

- \checkmark
 - Keep leaves, branches, trees, and other plant materials out of the lake.
 - Use No-Phosphorus lawn fertilizers, as lake weeds and algae grow with phosphorus runoff.
 - Remove dog droppings from the lawn and shoreline. <u>Never throw animal waste into</u> the lake.
 - Prevent any soil loss into the lake from new lawns, gardens, and construction dirt piles with barriers.
 - Protect shoreline property from erosion by stabilizing it with riprap or a vegetation buffer.
 - Pets, people, boats, lawn furniture, and anything you chose to wash should be cleaned where the water <u>can't</u> run into the lake.
 - Have your septic tank pumped every 2-3 years for year-round, 3 to 5 years for seasonal properties.

May to October we consistently monitor the lake's water quality by testing for phosphorus, chlorophyll-a, nitrogen, nitrate/nitrite, ammonia, algal toxins, and E. coli. The State's DENR collects this data for long term evaluation on how the lake is changing.
